## **FREE JULY 4<sup>TH</sup> CAB RIDES THROUGHOUT** **GREATER WASHINGTON**

***LOCAL, ANTI-DRUNK DRIVING EFFORT KICKS-OFF ON U.S. HOLIDAY WHEN  
MORE THAN HALF OF ALL TRAFFIC DEATHS ARE ALCOHOL-RELATED***

**Washington, DC, June 18** – As a direct response to Independence Day being that U.S. holiday when more than half (51%) of all traffic deaths are alcohol-related \*, a local non-profit group will be offering free cab rides to would-be drunk drivers throughout the Washington-metropolitan area this Fourth of July.

Offered by the nonprofit Washington Regional Alcohol Program (WRAP), the Independence Day *SoberRide* program will be in operation beginning at 4:00 pm on Friday, July 4<sup>th</sup> and continue until 4:00 am the following day (7/5) as a way to keep local roads safe from impaired drivers during this traditionally high-risk, holiday period.

During this 12-hour period, area residents celebrating with alcohol may call the toll-free *SoberRide* phone number **1-800-200-TAXI** and be afforded a no-cost (up to a \$ 50 fare), safe way home.

AT&T wireless customers can dial **#-TAXI** for the same service. Local taxicab companies throughout the Washington-metropolitan area provide this no-cost service to local residents age 21 and older who otherwise may have attempted to drive home after drinking.

***“Last Independence Day, 253 persons in Greater Washington did the right thing and availed themselves of this potentially lifesaving service rather than driving home possibly impaired, “ said Kurt Gregory Erickson, WRAP’s President. “For SoberRide’s hours of operation last July 4<sup>th</sup>, this translated into the removal of a would-be drunk driver from Greater Washington’s roadways every three-minutes.”***

*SoberRide* is offered in the: **District of Columbia**; throughout the Maryland counties of **Montgomery** and **Prince George's**; and throughout the Northern Virginia counties of **Arlington, Fairfax, (eastern) Loudoun** and **Prince William**.

Sponsors of this year's Independence Day *SoberRide* offering include AT&T Anheuser-Busch, Enterprise Rent-A-Car Foundation, ExxonMobil, GEICO and Red Top Cab of Arlington.

Participating taxicab companies include: Alexandria Yellow Cab, Barwood; Fairfax Yellow Cab; Loudoun Yellow Cab; Manassas Cab Company; Red Top Cab; Silver Cab of Prince George's County; Taxi Transportation Services; and Yellow Cab of Prince William County.

Since 1993, WRAP's *SoberRide* program has provided 40,844 free cab rides home to would-be drunk drivers in the Greater Washington area.

Founded in 1982, the Washington Regional Alcohol Program is an award-winning public-private partnership working to prevent drunk driving and underage drinking in the Washington-metropolitan area. Through public education, innovative health education programs and advocacy, WRAP is credited with keeping the metro-Washington area's alcohol-related traffic deaths consistently lower than the national average. WRAP, however, may best be known to area residents via the organization's popular free cab ride service for would-be drunk drivers, *SoberRide*.
