Commemorating its 40<sup>th</sup> year in 2022, the nonprofit [501(c)(3)] Washington Regional Alcohol Program (WRAP) is a coalition of diverse interests using effective education, innovative programs and targeted advocacy to end alcohol-impaired driving and underage drinking in the Washington, DC metro area. Through public education, innovative health education programs and advocacy, WRAP is credited with historically keeping the metro Washington area's alcohol-related traffic deaths lower than the national average.

WRAP, however, may best be known to area residents via the organization's popular free safe ride service to prevent drunk driving. SoberRide<sup>®</sup> – a public safety initiative which, since 1991, has provided 82,735 no-cost, safe rides home to Greater Washington residents who otherwise may have driven drunk.

**SoberRide<sup>®</sup>** Don't forget about WRAP's SoberRide<sup>®</sup> program this Halloween. If you're age 21 or older and celebrating with alcohol between the hours of 4:00 pm on Saturday, October 29, 2022 and 4:00 am on Sunday, October 30, 2022, download Lyft to your phone then visit [www.SoberRide.com](http://www.SoberRide.com) to obtain and enter the special Halloween SoberRide<sup>®</sup> code in the app's "Promo" section to receive a no cost (up to \$15) safe transportation home. Certain restrictions apply.
