

Programs offer discounted rides to help keep drunk drivers off DC-area roads

From March Madness celebrations to St. Patrick's Day festivities, it'll be a wild weekend in the D.C. area, and there are a few programs offering discounted rides to help keep drunk drivers off the roads.

Kurt Erickson, president of the Washington Regional Alcohol Program, said that drivers should be just as cautious as they would be on New Year's Eve.

Nationwide, 45% of all traffic deaths this weekend will be a result of drunk driving; in the D.C. metro area, that number is 25%.

"Still far too many," stressed Erickson. "Still one out of four."

He said his organization is offering an alternative to anyone who shouldn't be behind the wheel through their Sober Rider Program. Lyft is offering a \$15.00 credit through the program. Almost 85,000 people have participated since it began 32 years ago.

It'll be in operation at 4 p.m. Friday and will run until 4 a.m. Saturday. "We always anticipate a higher level of ridership," added Erickson. "The program is only as good as the number of people that use it."

The Maryland Department of Transportation's Highway Safety Office is also offering \$15 credits today and tomorrow.

Anyone heading out this weekend that may not be drinking, taking steps to fight drunk driving could still help make a difference. If you see someone driving impaired, call 911 in the District or Maryland or call 77 in Virginia.

It's also important to wear your seatbelt, an effective measure that could reduce death. "Buckle up," added Erickson. "It could be a lifesaving move."

WASHINGTON — In an effort to prevent drunk driving this St. Patrick's Day, a local nonprofit is offering free Lyft rides, with a value of up to \$15, to help get those celebrating the holiday in the D.C. area get home safely.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, nearly half of all U.S. traffic deaths on St. Patrick's Day involve drunk drivers.

To combat these statistics, the nonprofit Washington Regional Alcohol Program (WRAP) is offering free safe rides with Lyft.

The 2023 St. Patrick's SoberRide program will begin at 4 p.m. Friday, March 17 and run through 4 a.m. March 18.

During this 12-hour period, area residents, ages 21 and older, celebrating the holiday with alcohol may download the Lyft app to their phones, then enter the SoberRide code in the app's Promo section to get their free ride home.

WRAP's 2023 St. Patrick's Day SoberRide promo code will be posted at 3:00 p.m. on March 17 on www.SoberRide.com.

6 places to celebrate St. Patrick's Day in the D.C. area

From Ned Devine's in Herndon to the Old Brogue in Great Falls to Galway Bay in downtown Annapolis, the Irish pubs are going to be packed with revelers making the most of St. Patrick's Day, kicking off an unofficial three-day weekend. Friendly advice: No matter where you're going, try to arrive as early as possible. Lines usually start building in the afternoon, and no one wants to wait outside while friends are enjoying themselves indoors.

A tip for getting home after the party:
SoberRide, the Washington Regional Alcohol
Program's long-running anti-drunken-driving
program, offers free and discounted Lyft rides
home between 4 p.m. Friday and 4 a.m.
Saturday. Look for a code posted on
soberride.com at 3 p.m. Friday, and enter it
into the app for a \$15 ride credit. If the ride is
cheaper than that, it's free; if it's more, the
passenger pays the difference. A limited
number of credits are available, so keep an eye
on the website and grab the code ASAP.

The Dubliner - No D.C. pub does it bigger than the Dubliner, where the drinks began flowing and the bands began playing at 9 a.m. Friday. Expect bands to rotate throughout the day, plus party music from DJ Harry Hotter. There's a \$10 cover. (4 F St. NW.)

Across the Pond - Across the Pond got started bright and early Friday with Kegs & Eggs at 7 a.m. Expect pipers and Irish dancers throughout the day, and a live broadcast with DC101 from 7 p.m. to midnight. (1732 Connecticut Ave. NW.)

Mattie and Eddie's - Mattie and Eddie's threw open the doors at 9 a.m. on Pentagon Row, and the music starts at noon Friday. Dancers from the Boyle and McGrath schools perform throughout the afternoon. (1301 S. Joyce St., Arlington.)


Murphy's Grand Irish Pub - Murphy's Grand Irish Pub in Alexandria has a full day of entertainment planned: Live music, which started at 10 a.m. Friday, brings Pat Carroll, Pat Garvey, Brandon Kennedy and Colby Sard to the stage. (713 King St., Alexandria.)

The Irish Inn at Glen Echo - The Irish Inn at Glen Echo is known for live music, and the Galway Ramblers take the stage soon after doors open at 11 a.m. Friday. They're followed by the Bog Band, which plays from 3 to 7 p.m., and the Irish Inn Mates, who perform from 7 until close. The Culkin School of Traditional Irish Dance will make an appearance, too. There's a \$5 cover. (6119 Tulane Ave., Glen Echo.)

Ireland at the Wharf - Those who don't overindulge on Friday night can head to the Wharf on Saturday for even more celebrations. The District Pier turns into a pop-up beer garden with pours of whiskey and Guinness, hosted by the nearby Kirwan's Irish Pub. Entertainment inspired by the Emerald Isle includes Irish dancers and bagpipers; live music from the 19th Street Band, Poehemia and Ben David Band; and a craft corner for kids, along with lawn games such as oversized Jenga. Rugby fans will want to stake out a space in front of the big screen at Kirwan's to watch the Ireland vs. England matchup in the Six Nations tournament. (Noon to 6 p.m. Free.)

WASHINGTON (DC News Now) — Washington Regional Alcohol Program said it would offer free Lyft rides to people across the DMV on St. Patrick's Day. The SoberRide® program is intended to help combat potential drunk driving that celebrations could bring.

"Nearly half of U.S. traffic fatalities during St. Patrick's Day involve drunk drivers according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration," said Kurt Erickson, WRAP's President.

To take advantage of the offer, people who are 21 and older enter the SoberRide® code in the Lyft app's "Promo" section to receive free (up to \$15) transportation home. The promo code will be posted at 3 p.m. on March 17. People can take advantage of the program from 4 p.m. that day until 4 a.m. on March 18.



If you're hitting up one of Arlington's many St. Patrick's Day events, your ride home could come free courtesy of a local nonprofit combatting drunk driving.

The Washington Regional Alcohol Program (WRAP) is continuing its holiday SoberRide program this year for St. Patrick's Day 2023.

The SoberRide program will kick off at 4 p.m. on Friday, March 17, and will be active until 4 a.m. on Saturday, March 18.

According to a press release from WRAP:

During this twelve-hour period, area residents ages 21 and older celebrating with alcohol may download the Lyft app to their phones, then enter the SoberRide code in the app's 'Promo' section to receive their no-cost (up to \$15) safe transportation home. WRAP's 2023 St. Patrick's Day SoberRide promo code will be posted at 3:00 p.m. on Friday, March 17th on www.SoberRide.com.

The program is offered around the region, including in Arlington and surrounding localities.






