Founded in 1982, the nonprofit [501(c)(3)] Washington Regional Program (WRAP) is an award-winning public-private partnership working to prevent drunk driving and underage drinking in the Washington-metropolitan area. Through public education, innovative health education programs and advocacy, WRAP is credited with helping to keep the annual percentage of metro-Washington traffic deaths involving alcohol-impaired driving historically lower than the national average.

WRAP, however, may best be known to area residents via the organization's popular free safe ride service for would-be drunk drivers, SoberRide® – a public safety initiative which, since 1991 alone, has provided 90,769 no-cost, safe rides home to Greater Washington residents who otherwise may have driven drunk.

SoberRide® Don't forget about WRAP's SoberRide® program this Halloween. If you're age 21 or older and celebrating with alcohol between the hours of 4:00 pm on October 26, 2024 and 4:00 am on Sunday, October 27, 2024, download Lyft to your phone then visit www.SoberRide.com to obtain and enter the special Halloween SoberRide® code in the app's "Promo" section to receive a no cost (up to \$15) safe transportation home. Certain restrictions apply.

(SoberRide®, the popular free safe ride service to prevent drunk driving, is solely available via the Lyft mobile app ridesharing platform.)
